Strategies for Documentary Producers to Access the International Market

GUIDELINES

Eligibility

- You must be a resident of the UK;
- You must have a producer's credit on a completed and publicly broadcast / exhibited documentary;
- You must have at least two year's experience in the film or television industries;
- You must have a documentary project in development which is:
 - feature length i.e. at least 52 mins;
 - aimed at the international market; and
 - packaged i.e. a director is attached.

Applications

Applications should include:

- A completed application form;
- Your filmography, including details of any screenings or TV broadcasts;
- A synopsis and treatment of your documentary project – max 2 pages;
- Filmographies of key creatives attached to the project if applicable;
- Details of any funding already in place or interest from broadcasters / financiers;
- Supporting visual material if available (trailer, pilot, etc.). Pilots / trailers should be saved as Quicktime files. Large files should be sent via www.yousendit.com.
- A completed equal opportunities form.

Deadline for entries: 1 August 2008

Selection Criteria

Producers will be accepted on the basis of the proposal and supporting materials, and on how beneficial the programme will be to them. Successful candidates will be selected by industry professionals and informed by 16 August 2008.
